	<p>THE CONTENT: The courses are focused on diachronic linguistics, etymology, onomastics and the cognitive trend in linguistics. Students are introduced to the basics of etymologic analysis and the types of proper names, as well to main concepts, mechanisms and phenomena dealt with by cognitive linguistics. They also carry out statistical analyses of linguistic material. The courses in Applied Linguistics are centered around the questions of language acquisition and the learning theory (the behaviorist, cognitivist and constructivist approaches), as well as the differences between human and animal communication systems.</p>

Internship - second-cycle programme (MA studies)

2 ECTS credits, **2 weeks** (including internship organization, its completion, current preparation for work, as well as current and final discussion, documentary work, assessment and evaluation of the process with institutional and university internship mentors)

- internship is free of pay,
